## **Message from the Provost**

I couldn't be more proud of what the University of Ottawa has achieved in this second year of execution of our ambitious plan, Transformation 2030. Despite the ongoing challenges of the pandemic, the achievement of some of our goals has been accelerated. Scientific discoveries have been at the forefront throughout the pandemic, and many important projects have been led by the University of Ottawa, including research on COVID-19 variants and vaccine development.
