To compensate for the difference in credit value, students must complete an additional optional from the list "Other courses of interest".

<sup>5</sup> The course POL2203 is abolished and replaced by POL2103. Students who have completed POL2203 are exempted from POL2103 and will receive 3 credits POL2XXX. These credits will count as optional courses in the list "Other courses of interest" or as elective courses. Students who have not completed POL2203 will have to complete POL2103. To compensate for the difference in credit value, students must complete an additional optional course from the list "Other courses of interest".

<sup>6</sup> The course POL2207 is abolished and replaced by **POL2107 and POL2108**. Students who have completed POL2207 are exempted from **POL2107 and POL2108**. These credits will count in section A – Other courses of interest or as elective courses.

<sup>7</sup> The course POL3202 is abolished and replaced by POL3102. Students who have completed POL3202 are exempted from POL3102 and will receive 3 credits POL2XXX. These credits will count as optional courses in the list "Other courses of interest" or as elective courses.
