Note 3: There are three profiles. Students must choose one profile and complete 15 credits from a list of courses (of which three credits are compulsory). As for Profile III – Public Economy, students must complete 27 credits (or which 15 are compulsory).

*Students who choose Profile III – Public Economy must complete ECO1102 and ECO1104 included in the common core.

Note 1: Students who choose Profile III – Public Economy and who have not completed, prior to their registration, the Advanced Functions and Introductory Calculus 4U course (or it's equivalent) must take MAT1319.

Note 2: One or more of the electives should be chosen among the following courses: HIS2364, SOC2309, SOC3106, POL2108⁶, PHI2183.

Note 3: There are three profiles. Students must choose one profile and complete 15 credits from a list of courses (of which three credits are compulsory). As for Profile III – Public Economy, students must complete 27 credits (or which 15 are compulsory).
