#### 2. RECOMMENDATIONS

• Evaluation of Application

Students are evaluated based on the following criteria:

Academic Excellence 50% for Master's 30% for PhD Research Potential 30% for Master's 50% for PhD Personal Characteristics 20% for Master's 20% for PhD

- Regularly check the websites of the scholarships for which you have applied because information may subsequently be added or changed, which could affect the selection process
- Start preparing your application immediately
  - o Carefully consider your thesis project or dissertation
  - Write down different ideas
  - Take the time to discuss your project with your thesis supervisor
  - O What issues does your research project address?
  - o How are these issues important?
  - O What is the current state of knowledge about these issues?
  - o How is your methodology probative and related to the issues?
  - o How will your research contribute to advancing knowledge in your field?
  - o How are you qualified to conduct this research?
  - o Formulate your hypothesis precisely or present a well-structured research topic
- Design your research proposal/study plan
  - o Follow the writing restrictions specified in the scholarship application's writing guide
  - Your proposal/plan must be flexible, explicit and concise every word counts!
  - Clearly present each element of your project and specify its milestones
  - Feel free to highlight or underline sections of the text, if necessary
  - Avoid technical jargon or highly specialized terms
  - o Be sure to define acronyms and abbreviations the first time you use them
  - Write your proposal for a general audience
  - Feel free to ask someone who works in another field to read your research proposal.
  - o In summary, a research proposal usually includes a literature review, research questions, theoretical framework, methodology, contribution to knowledge (talk to your thesis supervisor).
- Contact your referees immediately
  - Make sure that the referees you have chosen can write an excellent letter of recommendation
  - Notify them of the application deadline
  - Send them a copy of your application:
    - Your research proposal/study plan
    - Your research contributions
    - A list of your major university accomplishments
    - An updated copy of your CV

- A writing sample or sample of your work
- Copies of your university transcripts
- A copy of the evaluation letter (SSHRC scholarship-form to fill out) and an envelope that is pre-addressed to you

## • How to choose your referees

- Your thesis advisor is a good choice to attest to the quality of your academic work
- o Your referees should have known you for at least two years
- The other letters may come from people who know your work and can attest to your intellectual and academic abilities
- They do not need to be members of the Faculty or of the University
- They can be professors who know you and who have graded your academic work
- o If necessary, feel free to contact your referees to politely remind them of the deadlines for their submissions in support of your application
