NAME OF NON-ENDOWED FUND

Dorothea Dadson Scholarship for a Student from a Racialized Community

INTRODUCTION

This scholarship was generously created by Dorothea Dadson.

PURPOSE OF FUND

To support an undergraduate student at the Faculty of Law, Common Law Section, who is a member of a racialized community.

SCHOLARSHIP DETAILS

Eligibility Criteria

Applicants must:

1. be a Canadian citizen, a permanent resident, a person with protected or refugee status, or an international student;
2. be enrolled as a part- or full-time student in the Faculty of Law, Common Law Section, of the University of Ottawa;
3. demonstrate financial need, as determined by the Financial Aid and Awards Service of the University of Ottawa; and
4. be a racialized person (member of a visible minority) and defined as a person other than Indigenous (Aboriginal), who is non-white in colour or race, regardless of place of birth or citizenship.

Value of the award: \$3,000

Number of awards: 1

Frequency of the award: Annual

Level or program of study: Undergraduate

APPLICATION PROCEDURE

Applications must be made through Online Scholarships and Bursaries, which can be accessed through uozone.uOttawa.ca, and should include:
