GUIDELINES FOR THE LIST OF EXAMINERS

- For the selection of examiners, please see Academic Regulation II-7 Theses.
- Maximum of one Thesis Advisory Committee (TAC) member can be nominated as a thesis examiner (excluding EPI programs where a TAC member cannot be nominated)

PhD Candidate : The proposed external examiner should be free of any conflict of interest with regard to the PhD candidate, the candidate's supervisor or the candidate's co-supervisor.

Examples of conflict of interest:

- A proposed external examiner has worked for the same university, organization or department or has been part of the same research unit as the supervisor(s) or the candidate in the past six years.
- There is an administrative or family link between the proposed external examiner and the supervisor(s) or candidate.
- A proposed external examiner is an industrial or government representative who has been directly involved in collaborations with the supervisor(s) or candidate in the past six years.
- A proposed external examiner is a former research supervisor, graduate student, or postdoctoral trainee of the supervisor(s).
- A proposed external examiner has collaborated or published with the supervisor(s) or candidate within the past six years.

This list, while not exhaustive, illustrates the nature of potential conflicts to be avoided.
