Restore is a multidisciplinary clinic, providing comprehensive primary care for patients as their foundation. Registering over 5,000 patients, with a waitlist of over 1,100, the Restore Clinic remained open to in-person visits during the COVID-19 pandemic, treating over 2,000 patients. Throughout the pandemic, the Restore clinic held weekly COVID-19 vaccination clinics, administering over 200+ doses. The clinic team completed over 300+ well-baby visits and administered over 100+ baby immunizations through their pediatric services. The clinic and its physicians support the BIPOC community through culturally relevant and sensitive care.
