Faculty Updates - New Leadership

Congratulations to two members of our faculty on their new leadership roles.

Dr. Lindsay Bradley, Assistant Professor, who has accepted the leadership role of Assistant Program Director, effective January 1, 2025, for a three-year term. She will also maintain her existing roles as the Enhanced Skills Family Practice Program Director and the Sports and Exercise Medicine Program Director.

Dr. David Ponka, Full Professor, has been appointed as the Interim Assistant Dean of Global Health for the International and Global Health Office (IGHO). He has led the Besrour Centre for Global Family Medicine at the College of Family Physicians of Canada and has been instrumental in our department's global health initiatives.

Preparing Residents for Emergency Scenarios: Dr. Adam Jones-Delcorde's "Nightmare" Program



Dr. Adam Jones-Delcorde, Lecturer and our Winchester Site Director, along with Dr. Aajab Abdulhussein, program co-lead, are leading a groundbreaking initiative to enhance acute care training for family medicine residents in our program. This program, inspired by a similar initiative at Queen's University and developed with guidance from its creators, is designed to prepare first-year residents for high-pressure "nightmare" scenarios such as shock, respiratory distress, arrhythmias and altered

consciousness.

Recognizing the critical need for acute care training during curriculum renewal, Dr. Jones-Delcorde, Dr. Abdulhussein, and their team have adapted the Queen's model to create a hands-on, simulation-based program tailored to Ottawa's unique needs. The program integrates bilingual learning materials, recorded lectures, and realistic simulation cases that mirror emergencies that residents may face while on-call in hospital settings.

Currently, the team is finalizing case scenarios and preparatory resources. The pilot project, set to launch in July at the SIM Centre, will include 12–16 first-year residents. This pilot will help refine the curriculum, aiming for eventual implementation across all first-year cohorts.

Dr. Jones-Delcorde highlights the program's collaborative nature, crediting the contributions of acute care practitioners and support from the Project Management Office. With its emphasis on practical skills and preparedness, the program exemplifies the Department of Family Medicine's commitment to innovative medical education, and the impact of establishing partnerships.

"Acute care is an essential part of Family Medicine, and the Outcomes of Training Project showed us that most FM residencies probably have a gap in this area. Queen's University solved this problem more than a decade ago with its Nightmares program, and we want to replicate their success. With help from Queen's, we hope to build a simulation-based program that can equip all PGY-1 residents in Family Medicine with the skills required to manage the most common emergencies that they'll face in the ED or the inpatient ward."
