RESEARCH DESCRIPTION:

How can we explain the start of Russia's aggressive war against Ukraine through the lens of IR theories (or theories of International Relations)? What are the driving forces and motivations of Russia in this war? What role do factors like power, statecraft, international anarchy, public opinion, sense of community play in the conduct of the war?

These are some of the questions that we are trying to find answers to based on insights from established theories of international relations (especially realism, liberalism, constructivism). With the war against Ukraine in its seventh month, scholars have recently returned to older theories of international relations (especially realism and liberalism). Especially realism and its proponents have attracted a lot of attention in recent months (e.g. Walt, Mearsheimer, Kissinger etc.). Our goal is to trace their arguments and discuss their salience. Students will be part of an international research team (with students at Sciences Po Paris, NATO Defence College Rome, Oxford) to study Russia's War against Ukraine with the help of IR theories.
