

TWO MASTER'S DIPLOMAS IN CRIMINOLOGY: UO-BE (DDCRIM) : INFORMATION FOR INTERESTED STUDENTS

Effective in the Fall 2017, students registered in the Master's program at the University of Ottawa will have the opportunity to choose, when in the thesis option, a 2 year program where they will receive two diplomas: Maîtrise ès arts criminologie de l'UOttawa **et** Master en criminologie de l'Université Catholique de Louvain (UCL) (Belgique).

Requirements of the program

To obtain these two diplomas, the student will:

- (1) spend the first year at l'UCL (September to June) and will have to successfully complete 8 courses including the Major Research Paper/Thesis Seminar for a total of 18 credits; and
- (2) spend the second year at the UO where you will complete 3 courses including the Research Seminar for a total of 18 credits. (see appendices)

The student is also required to complete a thesis under the supervision of two professors, an Ottawa University Professor and a UCL Professor; to successfully complete the thesis requirement, the student will have to defend the thesis before a jury consisting of the UO thesis supervisor and two members of the jury one of which is the co-supervisor from UCL (via videoconference).

Fees and funding

Costs associated with travel, personal expenses, health insurance, lodging, insurance and local transportation are the sole responsibility of the student.

Students registered at the University of Ottawa will pay their tuition to the University of Ottawa for the duration of the program.

Students eligible for the UO Admission Scholarship (8.0 average) will maintain the scholarship. The contribution of the Department of Criminology will also be honored according to the program modalities.

The selected candidates and those who have registered for this program will receive \$1000 per semester for a total of 2 semesters from the International Mobility Scholarship offered by the International Office and the Faculty of Social Sciences.

Students registered in this program may also apply for a scholarship offered by the Department of Criminology

To obtain student status at UCL which is necessary to obtain the UCL diploma, students will have to pay for administrative fees charged by the UCL during their first year.

Registration

1) Conditions

- Students must hold a Bachelor's degree with a major in Criminology or equivalent with a minimum average of 75% (B+) calculated from the last 60 credits.
- Have theoretical and methodological knowledge considered to be adequate. For more information please consult the following: <http://www.uottawa.ca/graduate-studies/programs-admission/programs/criminology>
- Understand, speak and write in French is essential to complete the courses at l'UCL as the papers must be written in French. If your first language is not French you will be required to bring proof of proficiency in French to be considered for the program.

2) How to register

- Registration via OUAC to the Master's in Criminology with Thesis Option following the procedures by the due date. See the following for more information: <http://www.uottawa.ca/graduate-studies/programs-admission/programs/criminology>
- Pay the administrative fees associated with the application process.
- Your letter of intention must indicate that you wish to register for DDCrim.
- At the same time, you have to inform the Graduate Office of the Faculty of Social Sciences that you are interested in applying for DDCrim by sending an email at the following address: scsgrad@uottawa.ca
- If you are admitted, you will receive an offer of admission by the UO. You will also receive a registration authorization from UCL that you will need to obtain your student visa. It is crucial that you respond to the offer of admission by the date indicated in the offer of admission. You will respond via uoZone.

Due dates

Until January 15 2018 :

1. Submit your application for admission to the DDCrim Master's program by following the instructions indicated on <http://www.uottawa.ca/graduate-studies/programs-admission/programs/criminology> and those explained in the previous section of this document.

If you are selected for DDCrim, you will receive an offer of admission. If you accept the offer of admission you will have to:

Before April 1st 2018:

1. Inform the Department of Criminology at the UO of the courses you hope to register for at the UCL.
2. Submit your scholarship application to the Department of Criminology. You do not need to submit an application for the International Mobility Scholarship which is automatically deposited in the student account in September of the first year of participation in the program for a total of \$2000.

Before September 1st 2018 :

1. Register for Health Insurance. See www.uclouvain.be/326646.html
2. Register at the University of Ottawa to LPR 1000 (during 3 sessions) to maintain your student status at UO during the first year.
3. Register at the UCL by completing the following form : www.uclouvain.be/etudiant-international and by sending the required documents to UCL.
4. Pay the administrative fees and any other fees required by UCL. The exact amount will be communicated to the student during the Winter semester.

In June 2019, register for those courses that you will complete at UO during the second year of your program.
