Additional points to note:

- Students are enrolled in a fulltime MA/PhD program and therefore are expected to be involved in program-related activities during the entire academic year (including the summer term), except during vacations. Please note that many essential program requirements take place during the Spring/Summer term (i.e., May-August). Additionally, students' first cases at CPSR are typically assigned between June-October (end of year 1, beginning of year 2). You may be expected to begin attending supervision prior to a case being assigned.
- In addition to statutory holidays and the December university break, the University of Ottawa allows for 3 weeks of vacation for graduate students (please note, Fall and Winter reading weeks are *not* approved vacation times).
- To meet your Case Conference requirement, you must attend <u>6 full terms</u> (i.e., 2 academic years of case conference, and present one of your cases to the rest of the group (usually in the Winter semester of your second year of attendance). Case conference takes place <u>Wednesday mornings</u>; exact dates are determined near the beginning of each term.
- The Clinical Research Methods course typically takes place in the Fall semester of Year 2. This course is designed to help
 students write a significant portion of their dissertation proposal. It is <u>strongly advised</u> to determine your specific topic and
 general methodology during Year 1 of the program to then be able to focus on aspects of your proposal for the Clinical
 Research Methods course.
- Students who enter the program in 2021 and later must take Multicultural Psychology to fulfill the social bases of behaviour core content course requirement.
- For students who have not met the second language requirement at the beginning of the program, it is strongly advised to complete this requirement as soon as possible. The University will not permit you to submit the dissertation <u>until the second</u> language requirement has been met.
- In Years 1 and 2, most students' schedules are structured around courses. Beginning in Year 3, the number of courses taken in a term is reduced and the percentage of time devoted to practicum training is increased. This change necessitates the active use of time management strategies from students, especially to ensure that sufficient time is devoted to the dissertation.
- Students may complete the Supervision Workshop as early as the Spring/Summer term of the 3rd year. It must be completed prior to internship. Please note that it is offered in English and French in alternating years.
 Beginning in the Fall term of the 2nd year, students will meet annually (one-on-one) with the CPI to update their individualized clinical training profiles and plans.
