
Add French immersion to your program. It's not too late!

- If you've received an offer: email <u>admissions@uOttawa.ca</u> with "I would like to enrol in French immersion" in the subject line.

No French test required if you study entirely in English.

Your next step: After you've received an offer of admission, write the Immersion Entry Test.



In late July, once you've enrolled, your statement of account in uoZone will show your amount owing for the upcoming academic year. We'll send you an email reminder in early August. While you should pay your tuition and fees as soon as you can, the final deadline is September 30, 2024.

Guaranteed housing for first-year and CEGEP students*

Apply via the Housing Portal in uoZone starting **March 26, 2024**. You'll have to pay a \$700 deposit to reserve your spot.

Apply early to get into your top choice of residence! First-come, first-served. You don't have to wait until you've accepted your offer of admission.

If you cancel your reservation by **June 28, 2024**, you can receive a full refund (minus a \$100 administrative fee).
